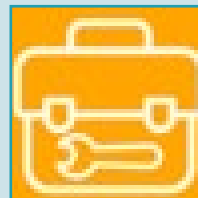

# Bibliodiversity

the diversity of book publishing in terms of the variety of national, regional and disciplinary contexts, including culture, language (multilingualism), quality assurance standards, transparency, publishing traditions, rewards and incentive structures at universities (including royalties), and the publishing industry and its market mechanisms in general.

## Types of publisher and publishing services

*There are multiple types of publisher which differ in their approaches and operating models but offer broadly similar services. This article details the types of publisher (or presses), the services you should expect and some of the charges you might encounter.*

### Types of publisher

Type of publisher	About	Examples
<b>Commercial publishers</b>	Commercial publishers are not affiliated to an academic institution. They have a for-profit business model, so money made in excess of operating costs might be paid to shareholders.	Springer Nature, Taylor and Francis, Bloomsbury Publishing, Brill Publishing, Cappelen Damm/NOASP, De Gruyter. Some well-known publishers are owned by, or imprints of, these organisations, e.g., Palgrave Macmillan (Springer Nature), Routledge (Taylor & Francis).

<b>University presses</b>	University presses are attached to a university / universities, and often receive financial support from them. They might receive academic support, e.g., peer reviewers or editorial boards might be drawn from the university's academic staff. If the press makes money in excess of its operating costs, this might be returned to the university.	Cambridge University Press, Oxford University Press, Manchester University Press, Harvard University Press, Michigan University Press.
<b>New university presses (NUPs)</b>	These are university presses established since the 1990s, often explicitly to publish open access books. In many other respects, they are run like a university press. However, as with library publishing (see below), NUPs are often library-led, albeit with an academic-led steering group or editorial board.	UCL Press, White Rose University Press, Huddersfield University Press, University of Westminster Press, Lever Press, Amherst College Press, Stockholm University Press, ANU Press, UTS ePRESS.
<b>Academic-led presses (ALPs), also known as scholar-led presses</b>	These are presses that are not affiliated to an institution, but are run by academics. They are almost all not-for-profit, meaning any money made in excess of operating costs is reinvested into the running of the press. As with NUPs, many of these presses were founded specifically to publish open access books.	Open Book Publishers, punctum books, Mattering Press, meson press, Open Humanities Press (which together make up the <a href="#">ScholarLed</a> consortium). The Radical Open Access Collective has a useful <a href="#">directory</a> of academic-led presses.
<b>Library publishing</b>	Some academic libraries provide publishing services, commonly producing journals but sometimes including books. They might work in tandem with a university press at the same institution.	The Library Publishing Coalition has a <a href="#">helpful list of libraries</a> that produce books.

## Business models for open access book publishing

*As open access ebooks are freely available for everyone to read, additional revenue sources are required to help cover the costs of publication. A variety of business models are used to support open access books, including, but not limited to, book processing charges, institutional subsidy, library membership and freemium models.*

Publishers use a variety of different business models to support open access book publishing. Some of these models require a fee to be paid by the author's funder or institution, but many do not.

### Open access book models<sup>1</sup>

<b>Freemium</b>	A version of the ebook is made open access or freely available at no charge to the author; the free access is subsidised by other revenue sources, such as sales of other e-formats, print sales, and/or library membership fees. <b>Institutional subsidy / New University Presses (NUP)</b>	An institution subsidises publication at an open access press based at or associated with the institution. <b>Library Membership</b>	Libraries or other institutions pay an annual membership fee to a publisher that underwrites some costs of making books open access; the member institution and/or its authors may receive additional benefits such as discounts on book processing charges (BPCs). <b>Library consortium ("Institutional crowdfunding")</b>	Libraries pledge a fee towards making a collection of books open access, covering some or all of the costs between them. <b>Subscribe to Open</b>	Libraries subscribe to or purchase specified collections of closed-access books, which may include backlist titles. <b>Crowdfunding</b>	Individuals pledge fees to make a book open access; once enough individuals have confirmed participation and the target amount is achieved, the book is made open access. 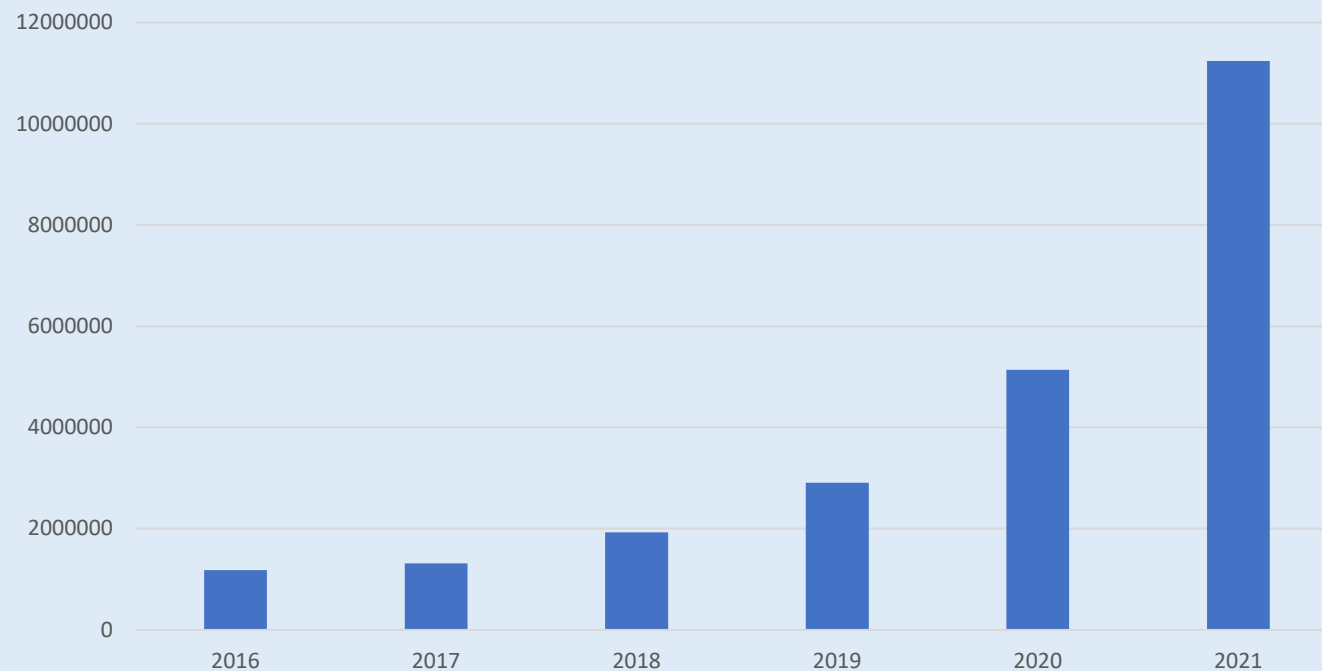

Peer Review Information Service for Monographs

PRISM provides academic publishers with the opportunity of displaying information about their peer review procedures across their entire catalogue, for individual book series, or even for single books.

The goal of the service is to provide transparency around the peer review procedures – opening the black box so to speak – and thereby build trust in academic book publishing.

The peer review information provided by the publisher will be visible to any reader and will also be added to the metadata of the books distributed by DOAB.

PRISM is currently operating in beta phase and will move into production in 2022.

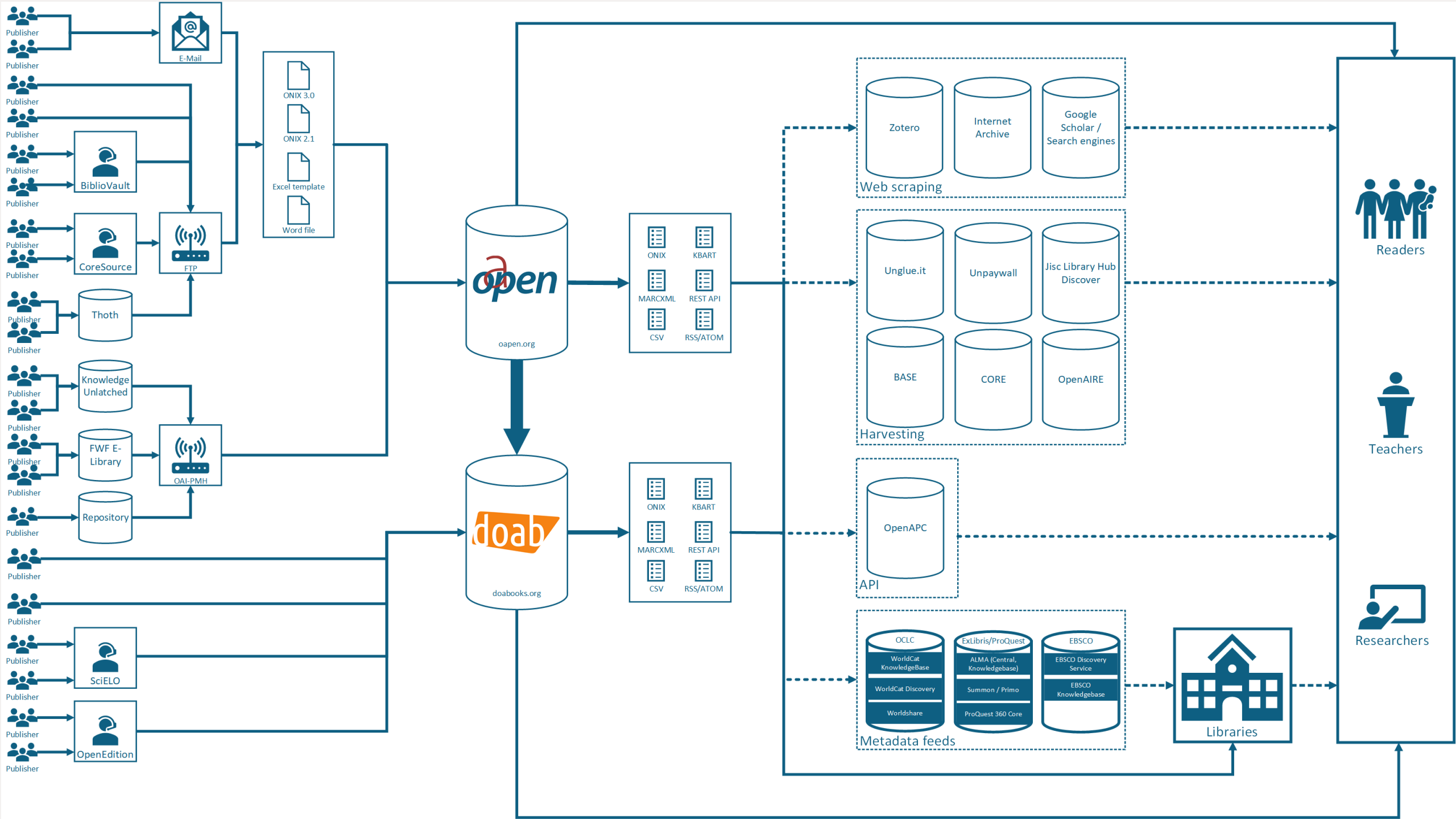

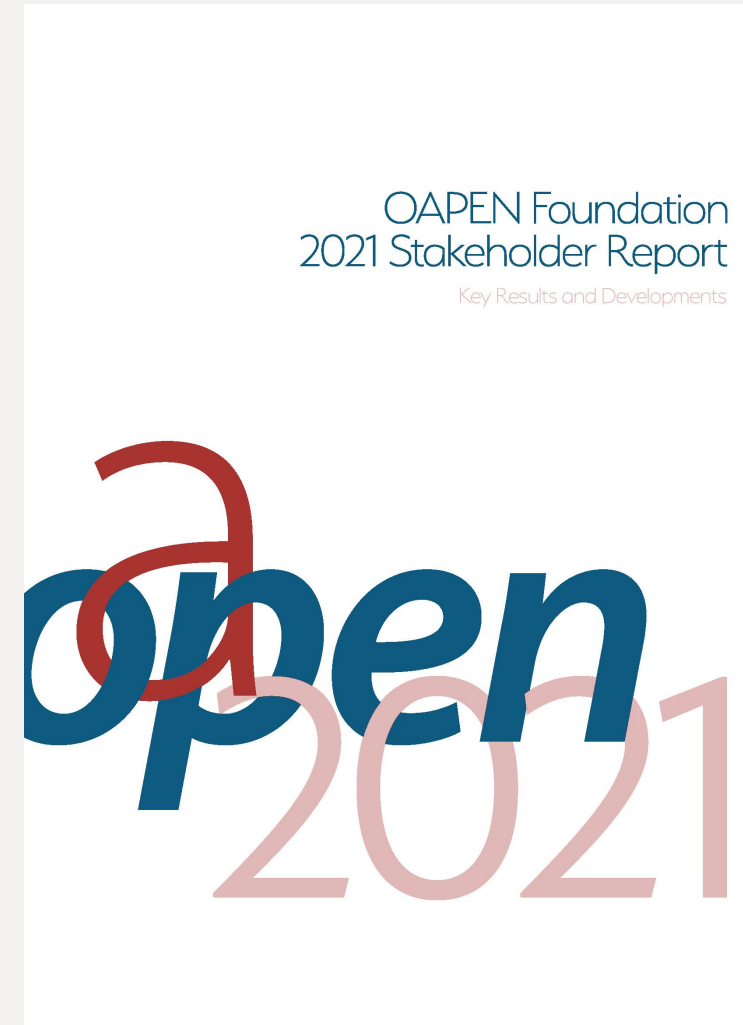
